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

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# THE PAINTED WORD reviewing the press releases

NEW YORK, NY.- Petzel Gallery announces Fight in an Elevator—a solo exhibition of new paintings and works on paper by Dana Schutz. The show is on view from September 10 – October 24, 2015.

VERBATIM P.R.!

As *Fight in an Elevator*, the title of Dana Schutz's second exhibition at Petzel Gallery suggests, Schutz's figures are placed within compressed interiors where they are forced to struggle against the boundaries of their painted environments and up onto the physical edge of the canvas. Her characters find themselves helpless in the mouth of a lion, exchanging blows in a mirrored elevator, or somnambulating down a narrow staircase. These highly structured spaces, which are both intensely public and utterly private, point to how Schutz tackles the subject of interiority—rather than offering a voyeuristic view, her frontal facing subjects stare directly back at the viewer, seemingly with the desire to extend outside of themselves.

Schutz's new works act as permeable containers with subjects often framed within a specific duration. Each composition extends and suspends time: elevator doors slide open just long enough to catch a grisly six-person fight, and elsewhere, body parts seem to melt then reconfigure in slow-motion. The gestures too bend time, informed by the momentum and weight of what they depict. Many figures, while engaged in myriad activities from breastfeeding to fist-fighting, seem to do so in service to the painting itself: one woman, ostensibly practicing S&M, bends backwards to nudge the edges of the canvas with her hand and foot. Schutz's characters work a double agenda: while embroiled in their own semi-private interiors, they simultaneously participate in the making of the painting.

Pity the poor canvases that must stretch in manic contortions whenever THE Artist Dana Schutz paints them. At one moment they are "interiorized," at another moment, Schutz's space-hogging creations threaten to explode those Dick Blick stretchers into a million wooden shards! Even Goatse would have an internal hemorrhage from all of Schutz's compressing, expanding, nudging and, clichéd as always, pushing the boundaries of those exhausted "edges" of art. (As John Simon would say, "How about stretching the *center* of art, for a change?")

Given the pressure the artist exerts on the edge while her characters "struggle against the boundaries," those must be some awfully lumpy canvases!

Columbia University's MFA program has apparently made considerable scientific discoveries. We are told that these paintings act as "permeable containers." (Could they be used to cook spaghetti?) Not only can Ms. Schutz's characters "bend time" and participate in painting themselves, but also while embroiled in stressful, semi-private accommodations. Surly the military will take notice of these advances!

Breakthroughs in physics have also been made. Otto Dix or Philip Guston may have had more *gravitas*, but they didn't possess Ms. Schutz's ray gun capable of both "expanding and suspending time."

Perhaps Ms. Schutz is also a star trainer at Soul Cycle? She exhausts her subjects with various stages of time travel, fistfights, melting, congealing and contortionist acrobatics. Is the P.R. author certain that gallery visitors aren't the ones who are "somnambulating," exhausted by witnessing this intense workout? And why do the painted subjects desire to "extend outside of themselves" and "exteriorize?" Does the Petzel gallery perform séances as well?

This press release does indeed "extend the boundaries" of sophistry, and a star is born in the phrase: *Ostensible* S&M!

Where was *this phrase* in the 70's when some New York artists worked in brothels to pay those 20% interest rates? "Your honor, my client was just *ostensibly* practicing S&M!"

Incidentally, this is what the art looks like. I was surprised the canvas is square, and not shaped like a potato from all of that kicking and "boundary expansion."



FUCKING STUPID


In the lecture halls of Yale in the mid-century, students would sit for twelve hours in rapture listening to the Delphi of the tetrahedra. On and on the motor mouth would oraculate about the fantastical yet not very useful. Like fever dreams and acid trips, the profundity was temporary. Buckminster Fuller added an American can-do optimism to his why-do-it-in-the-first-place ideas.

Fuller is best known for his geodesic dome. Aesthetically, geometric diamond patterns are somewhat more interesting to look at than a glass box; however, Fuller claimed, "When I'm working on a problem, I never think about beauty." That is because when the Bauhaus gang took control in Academia, designing buildings to "look beautiful" was bourgeois and a cardinal sin. No prob! Fuller was able to take his crank ideas and mold them into the new orthodoxy. Form followed function. His explanations of exactly what "function" his architecture served took many hours to explain.

Paradoxically, as the U.S. grew more prosperous after World War II, trendmakers from academia to fashion were obsessed with fat-cutting. Undecorated ugly buildings and anorectic models soon followed. Bucky's "Tensegrity" designs promised more with less. Structures would use lightweight tensions and stresses rather than heavy ed an architectural conference in the concrete or bricks or even standard steel frames. Lightweight! Lightweight! Everything in orthodox modern architecture had to be lightweight!



Fuller demonstrated a talent for seeming revolutionary, seeming like a rebel (even within the tiny world of the academic compound) while not really being a threat to anyone. The FBI was bored silly. Naturally, they were suspicious when he attend-Soviet Union, but upon investigation they were satisfied Fuller had only come there to talk bullshit.



Fuller was perhaps the first "starchitect" to defend his designs with meaningless environmental gestures and phony put a dome over New York City was a triumph of monumentalism over sanity. Fuller claimed that the money saved on snow removal would pay for the dome in ten years; however, pollution from cars and even heating and cooking would be trapped inside. At least Frank Lloyd Wright's fanciful mile-high skyscraper had ingenious historicist references such as flying buttresses and pyramids. Wright (What were you supposed to do if you was old-fashioned; he thought beauty was had to urinate at the same time?) As to still an important function of a building.

One of Fuller's acolytes is British starchitect Norman Foster. Foster's "Gherkin" skyscraper in London is kind of neat looking, but "neat" doesn't cut it in the compound. "Form must follow function." Elsewhere, Fuller designed ridiculous conservation. His geodesic-pipe dream to gizmos such as the "Dymaxion Fog Gun" which he claimed would clean the body with just one cup of water. This would not work; you might as well sponge bathe yourself. Form did not follow function! Speaking of "functions," Fuller designed a dymaxion toilet. If you thought low flow toilets were bad, Fuller's would use NO water; instead, your feces would be wrapped up in plastic for composting. where you would store your malodorous prodigies, best not to say. There ARE radical environmentalist recyclers who do this: they are known as "hoarders."

Films about the RAF or the IRA that depict the force-feeding of hunger strikers provoke a variety of responses: "Serves them right!" "Outrage." and "Ewww, gross!" These are *average* responses; however, it takes a *special* man, a very *special engineer* to instead reply,

"Cool! I'll have what he's having!"



Rob Rhinehart had a very first-world problem. He had trouble obtaining food. No, he was not starving. He was not impoverished with food insecurity. No, Obtaining and cooking food was just a *big drag*, ["I resented the time...effort...food was consuming"] it robbed him of his valuable time staring at a computer for 17 hours and coding. He decided he needed something quick and liquid.

But don't nutritional shakes *already exist?* As anyone who has cared for dying relatives knows, they are called "Boost" and "Ensure;" however, to quote SCTV's Andrea Martin, Rob didn't want a die-it, Rob wanted a live-it! He quickly "innovated" a new problem; flavor and taste have just got to go! Next came that most dreary and compartmentalized male notion, "*I looked at food as an engineering problem.*"

The mantra of the Bauhaus endures: "man and technology, the fusion!" We are all just machines to be engineered.

Rhinehart called his creation "Soylent." Wait—wasn't that a film where Charlton Heston discovers the food supply is human flesh? ("Soylent Green is people. It's people!") Rob insists the name was instead derived from a 1966 Harry Harrison story. Rhinehart is either being cagy or clueless, and the fact that we can't tell makes his marketing skills worthy of Warhol. Rob believes that just enough sucralose to overwhelm the taste of the vitamins will make us tolerate drinking the same Soylent everyday. In his otherwise excellent works of bullshit detection (The Painted Word and From Bauhaus to Our House) Tom Wolfe correctly identifies the International Style as a religious cult, but what religion does it most resemble? Which religion despised Catholic imagery and decoration? Which religion venerated the work ethic as a devotion to God? The International Style was secularized Neo-Puritanism with more prohibitions than Islamic architecture (which allows for geometric decoration).

Now comes Rob Rhinehart, ready to do for food what Skidmore, Owings & Merrill did for architecture, ready to strip down all of that garish luxuriousness and old, sentimental notions like "flavor" and pulverize decadence in a blender down to essential nutrients.

Rhinehart grew up in a fundamentalist protestant family, the perfect Petri dish for converting evangelist zeal into advertising hype. Predictably, Rhinehart venerates Buckminster Fuller, and he has quickly adopted Fuller's talent for augmenting self-promotion

with utopian visions and false environmental gestures.

Men would rather monotask and work long hours than face the domestic chaos of family. Did Rhinehart suffer trauma being dependent on a mother for food? Rob's humiliating dependency on food is like the helpless infant being dependent on the mother for nourishment, which motivates love, protection and expectations on the father. Rhinehart has created a new father-God. Soylent vanquishes Freud's "dependency need" and the maternal warmth of actual, savory food. Civilization conquers nature's more traumatic aspects: Rob reports that his stools are *tiny* and *rare* under a Soylent regime.

Be it minimalist architecture, be it empty recycling gestures, be it Soylent, the message is the same: sin repackaged in secular shrink rap. Humans are still *dirty* and *filthy*; our needs are "wasteful" and "inefficient." We are born in gore, devour unnecessarily, and produce vile filth. We need to be re-made, re-modeled, and reengineered. Salvation can only be found in working manically to find greater efficiencies, and getting small, small, small.

Rhinehart's October 24, 2014 post "Life Without Water" is his magnum opus of publicity seeking sophistry. He gives himself a challenge: consume no more than 4 liters of water a day! (Just what is it with these "visionaries" and water?). Since a single toilet flush consumes 6 liters of water, he quickly decides to micturate in the sink. Our pedant finds billions of years of evolution deficient: "Could we engineer more efficient kidneys?" he asks...God? —Or himself. Same difference at this point. If you wish to drink nutritious mud and indulge in other eccentricities then knock yourself out, but don't flatter yourself pretending you are saving the planet by "adopting some routines."

Despite money pouring out of helicopters and into every dumb tech-associated idea, I'm still not sure the private sector is the best platform for this minimalist evangelist. The barriers to entry would be fairly low: Abbott and Nestle already make nutritive liquid for ah, dying and starving people. How will Soylent compete? You can't just say, "Enjoy the new tastelessness of Soylent 3.0!"

A "non-profit" religion or academia would be a better place to hang out, just as "visionary" architects such as Fuller and Peter Eisenman were allowed to flourish despite the book-to-building ratio being high. A true Guru never lets such vulgar notions as "profitability" or "popularity" get in the way of utopia.

What's next? Pronouncements like "sex for pleasure is reactionary?" Will our children live to see that glorious day when, Biafran infant and billionaire alike will drink nutritious sludge? Imagine a world where decadence is sensual expunged nonfunctional and work and dymaxion sleep will be the only correct endeavors for Puritanism 2.0. The Puritan God, though dour, will be pleased.

#### WHIP IT GOOD! (and early)


The Puritans believed children are born evil. Proof? "A stubbornness and stoutness of mind.



Finally, there was a force more powerful than the Anglo-Puritan dread of debt. The cold war would assure that big government spending was here to stay. The age of war-Keynesianism had arrived.

"If you can have full employment killing Germans, why can't you have full employment building a society?" - Anthony Wedgwood Benn, quoting a fellow RAF pilot.

Time Magazine summarized John Maynard Keynes' theory thusly: "His radical idea that governments should spend money they don't have may have saved capitalism." These theories were known and tried in the thirties, but it took World War II to spend the necessary debt to properly stimulate the economy. The results were dramatic, as the RAF pilot above observed.

Business and ideologues were worried. Because government spending had transformed an intractable depression into full employment, they worried that voters might go the full monty and embrace socialism. A new form of propagandist was born: the economist-salesman.

First out of the gate was F.A. Hayek. His book *The* Road to Serfdom was serialized in Reader's Digest in 1945, just to make sure that those returning GI's didn't get any wise ideas. Hayek laid the melodrama on thick. Collectivism was just like that syphilitic whore the GI's were warned about. Seductive but fatal!





# THE AMERICAN DREAM IS THE SEDUCTION FANTASY OF A PEDOPHILE

American culture is schizophrenic and bipolar. The founding puritans were gloomy guses about the essential nature of man; yet, how does one explain the pie in the sky optimism? The queuing of Americans at the lottery ticket machines, credit cards in hand? "Hey, you never know!" bark the ads produced by State Lottery commissions, mindful of the fact that the sucker's cash will find its way into a lubricious lobbyist's pocket.

The Puritans believed in predestination. Simply put, if you are rich, it is because God intended you to be rich. This is very appealing to those who are already rich. Predestination was a fine and dandy rule for the rest of humanity, but what about ME?

One of Sigmund Freud's speculations was called "Family Romances." The theory posits that the child imagines that he was secretly adopted, and that his REAL parents are wealthy or possibly royalty. In the American milieu, this conveniently negates predestination and having to accept your station in life because, after all, you were meant for bigger and better things!

Horatio Alger Jr. (1832-99) wrote novels for boys that embodied the "rags to riches" myth, that you could "hack God" and choose *yourself* for riches (or at least middle class respectability) through hard work and heroic acts.


The *real* Horatio Alger was one odd duck, embodying some of the contradictions and complexities of America. He had an aristocratic lineage (he was descended from Puritan Pilgrims); unfortunately, God decided to "unelect" Alger's father from the fraternity of the wealthy. Alger Sr. defaulted on his debts and had to move his family to an agricultural town outside of Boston and became a Unitarian pastor. As a "poor" legacy kid attending Harvard, Alger Jr. was barred from joining clubs like Hasty Pudding. How *infra-dig!* Status-anxiety would become a lifelong theme both in Alger's life and his work.

Alger went on to write novels that "had tremendous sympathy for boys and discovered a calling for himself in the composition of boys' books."

#### Geez, you don't think that—oh yes! Go ahead and think it!

In 1866, Unitarian church officials in Brewster, Massachusetts accused Alger of "the abominable and revolting crime of unnatural familiarity with boys." Then as now, churches did not turn offenders like Alger over to the cops, they just politely asked him to leave. (The unsealed Church letters are now archived at the Harvard Divinity School.) Afterwards, the confirmed bachelor fled to New York and found his literary "calling" by writing about ambitious poor boys named "Ragged Dick," "Dick" and "Fosdick." Horatio Alger loved little Dicks!

In light of his "revolting crimes," Alger's novels read like a creepy old pederast's wet dream. Alger's lucky boys aren't necessarily the hardest workers, but somehow manage to grab the eye of a rich old patron. The boy is given an education, a warm home and even money to start his own business by the old perv.

Being a pedophile may not be a prerequisite to proselytizing or starting your own religion but, as Joseph Smith and others discovered, it sure doesn't seem to hurt! The seduction, the use of infantile yet fantastical tales, and the promise of power--the very same tools used in seducing the young come in handy when convincing the rubes that you posses the short cut to revelation. Alger may have just been trying to sell works of hack fiction, but as the authors of the bible and the koran knew, bad writing is no obstacle when it comes to religious myth making.

And make no mistake; Alger was creating a distinctly American religion by tweaking some of the kinks in Protestant Puritanism—by popular demand! The Puritan work ethic was all well and good, but this notion that God would arbitrarily pick the winners and losers was a bummer and had to go! Alger put a uniquely American spin on the Catholic notion of good works-you still had to work your ass off as a sign of grace BUT, maybe, just maybe, an act of incredible honesty or heroism might catch the big man upstairs' attention.

Like many prophets, Alger may not have been conscious about his divine revelations. His motivations for writing his books grew out of his own psychological complexity. Alger was a progressive with sympathies

for the underdog. Perhaps he was just trying to provide poor boys with hope and succor, something Alger practiced in his own life after moving to New York City.

Oh my, *did he ever!* Alger "informally" adopted street boys and lived with them.

The Horatio Alger myth didn't end with his death, it was only beginning, as myths frequently take on lives of their own. Alger's books were more popular in the two decades after his death. Advocates of Social Darwinism embraced his tales of bootstrapping.

Two very different institutions bear Alger's name. Ultra WASP Norman Vincent Peale (author of "The Power of Positive Thinking") created The Horatio Alger Award to honor ambitious right-wing creeps (Clarence Thomas; 1992 winner!) and the North American Man Boy Love Association named its New York chapter "The Horatio Alger Brigade." Both seek myths, but only one is practically outlawed.

Alger was—indirectly—right about one thing: gold digging your way from rags to riches has long been a tradition in America (see above).


Flash forward to 2015, and the big dipper is getting a little fuzzy.

The United States has never engaged in debt monetization, commonly known as hyperinflation. In fact, instances of hyperinflation in Western Europe or North America in the past 250 years are rare. Weimar Germany, burdened by war reparations, is the most famous example (although it was austerity measures that were later enacted that brought about the rise of Hitler). The Confederate States of America's paper currency became worthless when they lost the civil war. Pro tip: don't be conquered in war.

The United States *has* experienced dozens of deflationary depressions, usually due to ridiculously constrained monetary polices such as the gold standard or the Fed raising rates after a stock market crash (1929). So why do so many propagandists make it seem that inflation is an *equal threat*, despite historical evidence to the contrary? Fear mongering over the national debt is a tool used by opponents of government programs in a campaign to repeal the New Deal and everything it stood for.

The inflation of the 1970's was caused by more global demand for oil than supply, which trickled up in the price of goods. Oil producers had become lazy and inefficient. Nonetheless, so many took oil for granted that they were shocked by rising prices. A dreary morality tale was proffered that inflated prices were the wages of sin of a progressive agenda. Economist Milton Friedman promoted the quackery that jacking up interest rates could cure commodity driven inflation. In 1980, Fed Chair Paul Volker "heroically" put these theories into practice.





Your embrace of the culture of complaint and victimization here is somewhat under dig, as the ancient Latins would say, so for a moment could we just drop the pious baloney?






